WLSA Shanghai Academy offers three curricula on campus — Sino-Global Program (AP courses) and A-Level Program together with the WLSA Global Impact Program (GIP), and Chinese Gaokao Program. The GIP is a unique, interdisciplinary, skills-based curriculum that forms the foundation of a holistic vision of high school education in a globalized society. Built from the ground up, students at WLSA Shanghai Academy develop critical skills and competencies in a rigorous and empowering three-year program based on our core values: promoting academic excellence, creating community leaders, and developing global citizenship. Sino-Global Program students can choose 3-6 AP courses; A-Level Program students can choose 3-4 A-Level subjects.

#### Some examplary distinction courses are listed:

**Skills Development Program (SDP)** based on a coursework created by Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE); SDP is a project-based learning class. It fosters students' skills of performing research, critical evaluation, reflective learning, efficient teamwork (leading and listening), and effective communication.

**Colloquy** orignated by Winchester College in the UK; Colloquy is a project-based learning class that directly focuses on students' ability to communicate in a variety of forms. Academic writing, presentation, and teamwork skills are particularly targeted.

**Chinese Strategy** focuses on using the timeline and characters to introduce the history of China. It cultivates students' historical insight, fosters students' sense of historical mission, and enriches their personal life experience.

Cross Culture Philosophy and Ethics focuses on moral education, integrity, and ethical responsibility as a part of the international community. Through the course, students gain a wider understanding of ethical issues, particularly those that will affect them around the world.

Assimilation and Differences Across Societies (ADAS), adapted a course from Harvard-Westlake School; ADAS is a primarily Harkness-table learning class. Students analyze and contrast cultural values between the US and China, examining and predicting their own struggles before creating a plan of adaptation to the country. The class structure enables students to engage in a Socratic-seminar environment and learn how to be a productive member in discussion.

**Humanities Lab** is for GIP what Chemistry Lab is for Chemistry, a hands-on solution and real-world focused class. In this course, students take personal ownership of their learning, with numerous challenges and modern issues presented to them for individuals and teams to solve week by week. Students creatively and thoughtfully apply their own perspectives to cutting-edge educational concepts like Project-Based Learning (PBL) and Design Thinking towards an end-of-career product, performance, or outcome.

## **GRADUATION REQUIREMENT**

WLSA Shanghai Academy offers a rigorous university preparatory structure. There are two credentials offered:

The WLSA Shanghai Academy Diploma is examined and validated by the WLSA academic committee and the local Education Bureau, and accredited by Cognia. The more advanced WLSA Honor Diploma is examined by an independent Board of Examiners, containing more extensive requirements. The WLSA Honor Diploma Board is composed of representatives from Harvard-Westlake School, The Webb Schools, Phillips Academy Andover, Winchester College, and Marlborough College. The Chairman of the Board is Mr. Taylor Stockdale, Head Emeritus of The Webb Schools. The Board assesses and independently validates the standard of academic achievement, and awards the Honor Diploma fewer than top 10% graduates.

#### **GPA CALCULATION**

WSA uses a weighted 4.0 scale GPA system calculated with the year overall scores of all academic courses in a school year.


Students taking Advanced / Distinction classes may possibly gain an extra GPA under the scale of 5.0.

The weights of different courses are based on the teaching hours of the courses, and each period equals 40 minutes. The passing grade for all courses is 60 (D).


#### The WLSA Honor Diploma Board Requirement:

- 1. TOEFL iBT in a test setting 112+/ IELTS 7.5+
- 2. SAT 1520+/ ACT 34+ or AAA\*A (predicted grades) of four A-Level subjects
- 3. Achieve the GPA in first quartile of the year group in each academic year
- 4. Successful completion of all WLSA Distinction Courses
- 5. Completion of 10-hour community service per academic year
- 6. Participation in at least one WLSA education program / event The graduation date for the Class of 2026 is May 31st, 2026.


#### SG G10-11 Cumulative GPA Distribution


